Dear Interested Parties,

On March 9, 2020 Rhode Island Governor Gina Raimondo issued Executive Order 20-02, declaring a state of emergency for Rhode Island, and on March 13, 2020, the President issued a national state of emergency declaration for the country.

RIDEM has evaluated the impact that the COVID-19 public health threat and the declarations by state and national leaders have had on fuel supplies in Rhode Island. Based on this evaluation, RIDEM has determined that as a result of the public health threat and the emergency declarations relating to COVID-19, the public's driving habits have significantly decreased to the point where gasoline consumption has drastically dropped. RIDEM is aware that distributors are experiencing an over-supply of winter fuel relative to this time of year, making it difficult or impossible to shift supplies to a lower volatility fuel.

Based on the above conditions, RIDEM hereby waives the ASTM Class D-4 compliance requirements set out in Section 31-37-7.1(b) of the Rhode Island General Laws, and extends the ASTM Class-E-5 compliance requirement for gasoline through the month of April. This waiver shall take effect as of the date of this letter and continue through April 30, 2020.
