Any member, in good standing, can volunteer to serve on a NECSEMA committee. The Board of Directors and Associate Board are elected by the membership. All other volunteers are appointed by the Board of Directors.

NECSEMA State Chapters

CT/ME/MA/NH/RI

NECSEMA's State Chapters are responsible for representing and protecting the convenience store & fuel industry's legislative interests. Members participate in decisions regarding legislative priorities and work to improve grassroots legislative efforts. Committee members attend public hearings and meetings with legislators and government officials. They provide input about NECSEMA's programs and events in each state.



Each State Chapter determines priority issues and their meeting schedule. Generally, they meet monthly when their respective legislature is in session.

NECSEMA's State Chapters operate in five of our six New England states.

Membership Committee

The NECSEMA Membership Committee helps develop recruitment and retention plans each year. Some of the Committee activities may include:

Trade Show Committee
